



CODE OF PROFESSIONAL ETHICS AND CONDUCT

Core Values of the College

As an institution aligned with national objectives in its vision, mission and goals, Kamala Nehru College inculcates the following core values:

- To impart value-based education for holistic development of students
- To promote human resource development and capacity building of individuals
- To provide an inclusive, enabling and academically stimulating student-centric environment
- To promote digital, technological interface in pedagogical practices
- To empower stakeholders to realize their potential and fulfil their aspirations
- To foster a sense of social commitment for community outreach and national development
- To inculcate a sense of ethical consciousness and social collective conscience





Code of Conduct for Teachers

- The Code of Conduct for teachers is governed by the University of Delhi Acts, Statutes, Ordinances and Service Rules.
- Every faculty member should work within the institutional policies and practices so as to satisfy the vision and mission of the college.
- All members of the teaching staff are to work with sincerity, dedication and punctuality together with the Head of the Institution in pursuit of the Institution's development.
- Teachers are to fulfil their professional duties and responsibilities in the form of teaching, tutorials, practicals, seminars and research work, according to the existing rules, procedures, and methods.
- In addition to teaching responsibilities, teachers are to undertake duties of evaluation, invigilation and administrative work.

- They are to take leave as per rules with prior intimation, keeping in view their responsibility to complete the academic schedule.
- They are to make professional growth through continuous study and research.
- They are to participate in professional meetings, seminars, conferences etc. towards the contribution of knowledge.
- They are to discourage and not indulge in plagiarism and other unethical practices in teaching and research.





- Teachers are not to take on other employment and commitments which may interfere with their professional responsibilities towards the institution.
- Teachers are to maintain contact with the parents/ guardians, their students, send reports of their performance to the guardians whenever necessary.
- Teachers are to provide support and guidance for co-curricular and extra- curricular activities, including community service.
- Teachers are to respect the rights and dignity of every student and be fair to each student irrespective of the student's religion, caste, socio
 - economic group or social/physical identity.
- Teachers are to motivate students to pursue career success alongside holding scientific attitudes and practising their social responsibilities.
- Teachers are to encourage values such as respect, peace, democracy, humanism and social harmony among students.
- No member of the teaching staff is to engage in disruptive political activities within the college campus.





Code of Conduct for Non-teaching/Administrative Staff

- The Code of Conduct for non-teaching/ administrative staff is governed by the University of Delhi Acts, Statutes, Ordinances and Service Rules.
- All non-teaching and administrative staff are to work as per the working hours determined by the Institution, with one-hour lunch break on all working days.
- The members are to exhibit high standards of professionalism including honesty, dedication, punctuality, and discipline.
- Every staff member is to maintain the appropriate levels of confidentiality with respect to student and staff records or any other
 - sensitive matter.
- All staff members must refrain from any form of harassment or discrimination relating to gender, sexuality, marital status, religion etc. towards colleagues, teaching faculty and students.
- Teachers are to maintain active membership of professional organisations and strive to improve the education and knowledge system through them.
- The working hours of teachers are to be according to their time-table and any other additional duty assigned to them.





Code of Conduct for Students

- All students are expected to abide by the rules and regulations of the college.
- Students are to adhere to the timetable for attending classes and extra-curricular activities.
- As per the university rules students are expected to attend a minimum of 66.6% of the total number of lectures and tutorials delivered in the college.
- Use of mobile phones in classrooms, tutorial rooms, auditorium and corridorsis strictly prohibited.
- Students falling short of attendance will be detained and not allowed to take the examination as per the university rules.
- Students not attending classes for more than a week are to inform the Teacher In-Charge about the reason for their absence.
- In case of sickness the application must be supported by a medical certificate and prescription to be submitted.
- Students missing classes because of extra-curricular activities are required to apply for ECA slips and submit to the administration on a monthly basis.
- Students' attendance in all major college events is strongly encouraged.
- Students are to respect the rights and dignity of every teaching and non-teaching staff member.





- Students are to completely refrain from plagiarism in academic work.
- Students are to obtain clearance from the College before the University examination.
- Students are to carry their Identity Card within the campus.
- Students must help to keep the campus neat and clean.
- Spitting, smoking and littering on campus should be avoided.
- Students should not misuse college property.
- Students should not indulge in any kind of ragging, harassment of any kind towards their peers.
- Students must carry their Identity card inside the campus.

• Students are expected to read notices/circulars displayed on the notice board.

• Any violation of the above rules will lead to disciplinary action.





Code of Ethics to Check Plagiarism in Academic Work

- Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi, is one of the leading higher institutions for women.
- Kamala Nehru College has an effective system in place for detecting and penalising plagiarism so as to discourage the practice.
- The college provides guidelines to be adopted by its students and faculty to understand and avoid plagiarism in academic work.
- Plagiarism involves the following:
 - turning in someone else's work as your own
 - copying words or ideas from someone else without giving credit
 - failing to put a quotation in quotation marks
 - giving incorrect information about the source of a quotation
 - changing words but copying the sentence structure of a source without giving credit
 - copying so many words or ideas from a source that it makes me the majority of your work, whether you give credit or not (see our section on "fair use" rules)





Mechanisms to Prevent Plagiarism

- The College has a software 'URKUND' (Anti-plagiarism software) and is being successfully used at Kamala Nehru College library. URKUND's system checks all documents against two central source areas: a. The Internet and b. Published material such as Journals, Books etc.
- Members of faculty to avoid plagiarism in both teaching and writing research papers and books.
- Members of faculty are required to introduce students to plagiarism in academic work and referencing.
- The members of faculty are required to contact the College Librarian to create an account for checking plagiarism.
- Students should be encouraged, to the extent possible, to submit their assignments/term papers in Microsoft Word doc or PDF format.
- Students should be informed that they will be penalized for engaging in plagiarism.
